

### **Aggie Jumpstart Introduction**

### Description

The Aggie Jumpstart Program is designed to assist students to prepare for success in college level math and English. The four-week program encompasses an intensive skills enhancement program for first-time freshmen. NMSU faculty provide instruction to augment student academic preparedness for math and English courses. The program is also designed to acclimate students to the New Mexico State University campus through a cohort model that provides students with co-curricular and residential based experiences. Students participate in co-curricular activities such as leadership development, career development, college life and academic success skills that are designed for student success. The summer 2022 cohort of eleven selected students also had the opportunity to earn college credit in the Fall 2022 semester by enrolling in the ARSC 1120 course. In addition, students were able to participate in social activities in and around Las Cruces that strengthened their support network among their peers. Aggie Jumpstart students had the opportunity to participate in programming throughout the 2022-2023 academic year through a specially designed course (ARSC 1120) facilitated by the College of Arts and Sciences and the Student Success Center. Aggie Jumpstart Participants also received an 8th Generation Apple iPad, Case/Keyboard, Stylus, and 3-year Apple Care Plan for completing the program. Program costs were assumed by donors and NMSU.

#### History

The Aggie Jumpstart Program commenced in the summer of 2019 with nineteen participants. The Program was based on participants enrolling in developmental English (CCDE 1110) and math (CCDM 114) courses that were taught on the NMSU Las Cruces campus by Dona Ana Community College faculty. The goal was for Program participants to successfully complete both developmental courses so that they may start the Fall 2019 semester in college level English and math. The Program also included exposing participants to co-curricular activities, faculty connections and residence life.

The Program paused for the summers of 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In the summer of 2022, the Program shifted from a developmental course completion program to an English and math seminar success program designed to generate the skills for success in both subject areas. The Aggie Jumpstart Program's design comprised of a four and one-half week program that focused on enhancing student academic preparedness in the aforementioned subject areas instructed by NMSU-Las Cruces faculty. The Program also focused on acclimating students to the NMSU campus and local community by offering programming opportunities with a goal of building a network of support among the Aggie Jumpstart participants. In addition to math and English instruction, Aggie Jumpstart participants engaged in activities designed for college success such as tutoring, time management tips and skills, StrengthsFinder, ASNMSU presentations, Canvas tutorial and introduction to NMSU platforms (e.g., Navigate, ECMC Financial Literacy, You@NMSU, Handshake, Crimson Connections). Aggie Jumpstart participants also had the opportunity to attend the Las Cruces Farmers Market, hike Dripping Springs, explore White Sands, participate in the ax throw at Aggie Axes, attend a El Paso Chihuahuas baseball game, and participate in movie nights at local theaters. Attachment A provides a high-level overview of the 2022 Aggie Jumpstart Program.

### **Purpose**

The purpose of the Aggie Jumpstart Program is to foster participant academic success at New Mexico State University by preparing them for college level coursework in math and English, acclimating students to campus and the Las Cruces community through programming and teaching students the skills necessary to be successful in college. The intended outcomes of the Program are for participants to place into college-level math and English and to persist towards graduation at New Mexico State University. The primary stakeholders and benefactors of the Aggie Jumpstart Program are the participants. Donors and New Mexico State University are secondary stakeholders as the success of the Aggie Jumpstart Program participants is the overall goal of the investment that is being made into the Program.

### **Aggie Jumpstart Impact**

### Milestones

The high-level milestones associated with the Aggie Jumpstart Program are as follows: 1) *Plan the Aggie Jumpstart Program*, 2) *Recruit for the Aggie Jumpstart Program*, and 3) *Implement the Aggie Jumpstart Program*. The planning for the Aggie Jumpstart Program commenced in January of 2022. Key campus constituents met in an effort to design a Program that would meet the needs of participants and foster their academic success at New Mexico State University. The design of the Program as well as the development of marketing assets (See Appendix B-Student Recruitment Flyer) was executed in April of 2022. Recruitment of participants commenced with the first Aggie Welcome Orientation offered in May and concluded with the last Aggie Welcome Orientation offered in June. The Center for Academic Advising and Student Support, Aggie Welcome and Orientation, College of Arts and Sciences, and the Student Success Center were instrumental in recruiting eleven participants to participate in the 2022 Program (See Appendix C-Program Sheet). The implementation phase of the Program started on Sunday, July 10, 2022 and concluded on Tuesday, August 9, 2022.

#### **Key Performance Indicators**

The Aggie Jumpstart Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) include both participant satisfaction and academic outcomes. The overall participant satisfaction KPIs included data related to improved engagement with New Mexico State University, recommendation on whether the Aggie Jumpstart Program should be offered the, following summer, engagement with the Peer Mentor, evaluation of key activities, and recommendations for program enhancement. The data related to Program satisfaction was overall positive with participants highly satisfied with the Program and the peer and professional staff who supported them throughout the summer portion of the Program.

The KPIs related to academic outcomes of the Aggie Jumpstart Program include the following:

- 1) placement in college level math and English
- 2) math and English pass rates
- 3) ARSC 1120 pass rates
- 4) first semester academic standing
- 5) first semester grade point average
- 6) first year retention rates.

Table 1 provides data related to math and English placement outcomes that demonstrate 90.9% of Aggie Jumpstart participants placed into college-level math and 81.8% placed into college-level English in the Fall 2022 semester.

The math pass rates for participants were promising. For the college-level courses, 80% of participants passed their math course while one student withdrew (10%) and one student failed their course (10%). The participant enrolled in the math developmental course successfully passed the course (100%).

The English pass rates for participants were promising as well. For the college-level courses, 87.5% of participants passed their English course, while one student failed their course (12.5%). One participant enrolled in a developmental English course passed (50%) while the other participant failed (50%) the developmental course. One participant who placed into college-level English did not enroll in an English course for the Fall 2022 semester.

The Aggie Jumpstart participants had the opportunity to earn college credit in the Fall 2022 semester by enrolling in the ARSC 1120 course with their fellow Aggie Jumpstart cohort members. Ten of the participants opted to enroll in the course that was facilitated by College of Arts and Sciences and Student Success Center personnel. ARSC 1120 pass rates were high with 100% of participants passing the course.

The academic success Key Performance Indicators demonstrate an average first semester grade point average of 2.91, a 72.7% good academic standing designation, and a 63.6% first-year retention rate among the 2022 Aggie Jumpstart participants.

### Analysis, Strengths and Enhancements

The Aggie Jumpstart Program demonstrates strengths in participant satisfaction with the Program, college-level math and English placement rates, pass rates of college-level math, English and ARSC 1120 courses, and first-semester grade point averages. The Aggie Jumpstart Program's areas for enhancement with respect to participant outcomes includes the need for higher rates of academic standing and first-year retention; which are key to the overall goal of participant persistence to graduation.

### Opportunities/Recommendations

The opportunities of the project, per the analysis provided, is to seek additional strategies to continue engaging with participants at the conclusion of the ARSC 1120 course while also directing students into

additional student success programs. The need for continued "sense of belonging" is key to college success that may warrant additional engagement via a peer or professional mentoring program for Aggie Jumpstart participants. Therefore, it is the recommendation that the Program continues to operate with the goal of scaling to twenty participants, if funding permits. The scope of the Aggie Jumpstart Program, KPIs and outcomes should continue with adjustments to the design of the Program being considered based on satisfaction and academic data.

### **Aggie Jumpstart Program** July 10- August 9, 2022

### **Program Overview**

Aggie Jumpstart provides students with the opportunity to live on campus, receiving instruction that will lead to academic success, while participating in co-curricular and social activities. The instruction includes an intensive program of Math and English in preparation for the Fall 2022 semester. Participants will also receive an 8th Generation Apple IPad, Case/Keyboard, Stylus, and 3 year Apple Care Plan for completing the program. 100% of the costs will be assumed by NMSU.

### **Program Description**

The Aggie Jumpstart Program is designed to assist students to prepare for success in college level math and English. The four-week program will encompass an intensive skills enhancement program for first-time freshmen. NMSU faculty will provide instruction to augment student academic preparedness for the math and English courses. The program is also designed to acclimate students to the New Mexico State University campus through a cohort model that will provide students with a co-curricular and residential based experience. Students will participate in co-curricular activities such as leadership development, career development, college life and academic success skills that are designed for student success. The twenty selected students will also have the opportunity to earn college credit in the Fall 2022 semester by taking the ARSC 1120 course with their fellow Aggie Jumpstart cohort. In addition, students will be able to participate in social activities in and around Las Cruces that will strengthen their support network among their peers. Aggie Jumpstart students will have the opportunity to participate in programming throughout the 2022-2023 academic year through a specially designed course (ARSC 1120) facilitated by the College of Arts and Sciences and the Student Success Center.
